A Course of Study for Adults

How can people of faith contribute to the creation of a just peace for Israelis and Palestinians?

Objectives of the Study:

- 1. To understand the background of the conflict between the Israelis and Palestinians.
- 2. To understand current developments in the Middle East.
- 3. To consider possible alternatives for resolving the conflict.
- 4. To become advocates of a just peace for Israelis and Palestinians.

Format of the Study:

The course consists of three to five one-hour sessions, beginning with an introduction to the conflict, and ending with a discussion of ways to advocate for a just peace. Friends of Sabeel-Colorado will work with you to craft a course that best meets the needs of your group. Resource people who have first-hand experience of Israel/Palestine are available to meet with your group, to present information and slides, and to facilitate discussion. There are also several excellent videos available that your group may wish to include in the study.

Possible Class Sessions

1. Introduction to the Conflict

This session will discuss the beginnings of modern Zionism, the UN partition of 1948, Palestinian refugees, the Israeli military occupation that began in 1967, and the realities of Palestinian life under occupation.

2. The Role of the US, the Media and the Israeli Lobby

This session will discuss US policy in the Middle East, and the role of the media and the Israeli lobby in maintaining the current situation.

3. Challenging Christian Zionism

What is Christian Zionism? How do Zionist Christians use the Bible to support the current State of Israel, and what does the Bible really say?

4. Current Developments and Alternative Solutions

This session will consider the current situation in Gaza, Lebanon, and the continuing development of Jewish Settlements in the West Bank. What are Bantustans and will apartheid prevail? What is the Two-State solution *vs.* the One-State solution?

5. Advocating for a Just Peace

This session will discuss options for responding including: lobbying of Congress, divestment, boycotts, responding to the media, and education.

Ron Forthofer. Retired university Professor. Green Party candidate for Colorado Governor. Peace activist and delegate with Christian Peacemaker Teams to Hebron.

Rev. Larry Grimm. Presbyterian minister. He has been active with Middle East Peacemaking since 1980, and participated in dialogue with the American Jewish Committee and Palestinian Christians through the Colorado Council of Churches.

Joy Lapp. Instructor of Religion and Ethics, Metro State College of Denver. She spent three years in the Middle East working with Mennonite Central Committee.
